

REGULATIONS FOR SUBMITTING DONATIONS

1. The website is run by the Common Thing Foundation, based in Katowice (40-058), 17 Stalmacha Street, Tax Identification Number 6342849813, entered in the Register of associations, other social and professional organizations, foundations and independent public health care facilities by the District Court of Katowice-Wschód in Katowice, VIII Economic Department of the National Court Register under the KRS number 0000582159.
2. The website enables financial support for the Foundation's statutory activities.
3. These regulations are intended to define the conditions for making donations online using the form available on the website, operated by the PayU website.
4. Online payments are handled by the payment operator PayU S.A., 186 Grunwaldzka Street, 60-166 Poznań, Tax Identification Number 7792308495, REGON number 300523444, entered into the Register of entrepreneurs by the District Court in Poznań – Nowe Miasto and Wilda in Poznań, 8th Commercial Division of the National Court Register under the KRS number 0000274399.
5. Any adult natural person, legal person or organizational unit may make a donation. These persons will be hereinafter referred to as "Donor".
6. Donations made via the website are made continuously.
7. In order to make a one-off donation, after completing the form available on this website, the Donor is redirected to the operator's website.
8. As part of online payments, the Donor can make payments using: electronic transfers (including BLIK), traditional transfers and payment cards. The current list of cooperating banks and payment methods is available on the website.
9. Each Donor who completes the form and goes to the website may additionally express voluntary consent to the processing of data provided in the form for marketing purposes, in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.
10. By completing the data in the Form, the Donor accepts the Regulations and consents to the processing of Personal Data by the Foundation, in accordance with the terms of the Regulations and for the purposes specified therein.
11. The administrator of personal data is the Common Thing Foundation, data above.
12. The donor has the right to access the data, correct it, request its deletion, as well as the right to limit processing, object to the processing of personal data and the right to

lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority if the data is processed inconsistently with legal requirements.

13. The data will be processed for the purpose of concluding and performing the donation agreement concluded with the Administrator and making the necessary settlements in connection with its conclusion (if necessary), as well as for the purpose of fulfilling our statutory activities. If you express additional voluntary consent, your data will also be processed for marketing purposes.
14. The data is not processed by the Administrator in a fully automated manner and is not profiled.
15. Providing data is voluntary, but the consequence of not providing it will be the inability to conclude a contract.
16. To the extent that data is processed on the basis of separate consent, the Donor has the right to withdraw consent at any time. However, this will not affect the lawfulness of data processing carried out before its withdrawal.
17. Personal data will be processed basically until the expiry of the limitation period for claims and obligations arising from the contract concluded with the Administrator.
18. In justified cases, the Donor may file a complaint and request the return of the donated donation. Complaints should be submitted to the following address: biuro@rzeczspoleczna.pl, writing "Complaint" in the subject line and providing the reason and detailed transaction details. Each complaint will be considered individually by the Foundation within 14 days from the date of receipt of the complaint.
19. The Foundation has the right to change the Regulations at any time.
20. In matters not regulated by these Regulations, the provisions of generally applicable law shall apply.
